Welcome to Ilwaco High School where we provide a comprehensive program ranging from traditional courses to Advanced Placement offerings in science, English, math, history and art. In addition to regular school programs, students have opportunities through Running Start and on-line courses. Furthermore, we offer remedial courses to students who do not meet standards in language arts, mathematics, and science.

We reside on the Long Beach Peninsula and are the home of 300 "Fishermen" in grades 9-12. We have 20 teachers, 1 academic advisor, 3 instructional assistants, 3 support staff, 1 principal, a mental health counselor, and an intervention specialist. Approximately 65% of our teachers have a Master's Degree.

We take pride in the quality of education we offer and our students' academic success. Our goal is to continue to increase student achievement in a safe and nurturing environment where individuals are valued.

Students have six classes per day that meet for approximately 55 minutes per day, five times per week for 18 weeks. Classes earn .5 credits per semester. We also have advisory each Friday for 40 minutes.

Students in the class of 2015 and beyond are expected to pass state assessments in reading, writing, science and mathematics in order to graduate. Some students will meet graduation requirements in reading and writing through new English language arts exams.
